



Theme: Relational Evangelism

Matthew 28:19-20 NLT

Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. 20 Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age.

“Show me my part in your mission.”

In the military, the mission is never carried by one person alone. Even though the servicemember wears the uniform, the whole family works together as one unit, enduring early mornings, long nights, unexpected moves, and seasons of separation. Everyone has a part in strengthening, supporting, and sustaining the mission. Victory is not accidental; it is achieved together.

The Kingdom of God functions the same way. Jesus never intended His Great Commission to rest on the shoulders of a select few. “Go and make disciples,” was spoken by Jesus to all who follow Him. Every believer has a role. We are all living examples to a watching world. We have opportunities to carry out the mission of Christ every day—through how we speak to a barista who messes up an order or the patience we extend to a disrespectful child. Through relational evangelism, we demonstrate Jesus in the way we listen, serve, and share our faith journey.

The beauty of this mission is that Jesus does not send us out alone. He promises, “I am with you always.” His presence empowers our purpose and guides our steps. When we are mission-minded and mission-ready, we will live a mission-accomplished life—not in our own strength, but in His.

Pray: Father, lead me in how I pray and proclaim your amazing name to those who desperately need you.

Share: Share a time when you tried to complete a “mission” in your own strength. What was the result? What might be your role in the Great Commission? How are you actively pursuing evangelism in your community? What are a few situations in your daily routine where you can initiate an intentional faith conversation with someone who might need to hear the Good News of Jesus?



Suggested Prayer Topics

- Pray for yourself. Ask God to bring to the surface what you need to learn from the scripture or what needs to be addressed within your heart and renew the desire to engage with those that need the hope of Jesus.
- Pray for Stonecroft Ministries. Pray for the mission of the ministry, the Board of Directors, National Office staff and volunteers across the nation.
- Pray for the needs of your family and friends. Pray that God gives you opportunities to speak into their lives and gives them hope and encouragement only found in Jesus.
- Pray for local Outreach Groups (Women's Connections, Bible studies, etc.) and your community. Pray for opportunities to share the Gospel. Pray for hearts and minds that are ready to receive him.
- Pray for our nation. For wisdom and protection of our leaders on every level, our workplaces, and our families.
- Pray for global evangelism. Pray that every woman everywhere would be reconciled to God through Jesus Christ.
